Description:	Join art historian Joseph Cassar as he examines enduring themes that artists have depicted throughout the ages. These themes include portraiture, landscape, sacred art, and the human figure. Each theme will b explored in a series of artworks with a discussion in terms of concept, color, and composition and how the theme developed through time and how the cultural norms of the day influenced the choices made by the artist. Description:	In the first part of the Music of Beethoven, students will learn and examine the early life of Ludwig Van Beethoven as a composer and pianist, up through his “watershed years” of 1801 to 1802, when his deafness changed the course of his own life. Topics to be covered include Beethoven’s early life, the Classical Era in music history, Beethoven’s Early Period as a composer and pianist, his early sonatas, piano trios, and start of his symphonies, Beethoven’s increasing deafness, the Heiligenstadt Treatment, the transformation of Beethoven to write his music in a new and unique style, and more. (5 weeks)

Description:	Studying past presidential elections can help us better understand how the US system has evolved and raise our awareness of how campaigns are waged as well as, how we can respond to them. In this class, students will discuss, review and develop a better understanding of how the US system of elections has evolved. Explore the earliest days of US elections, the Jacksonian Era, discuss the effect of the Civil War had on US elections and those elected after being touched by fire in the war, the turn of the 20 th century, the depression and World War II, Camelot and the Great Society, the 21 st century, and the modern system, and more.
