
Why Forward Party?

Legislative Priorities

1. Ranked Choice Voting

RCV encourages candidates to appeal to more voters and ensures that winning candidates have been approved by more than 50% of the voters.

2. Single All-Candidate Primaries

Voters should be able to consider all candidates and elected officials should allowed to disagree with their own parties without being primaried.

3. Independent Redistricting Commissions

A body separate from the legislature should define voting districts to remove bias and ensure that minority groups are fairly represented.

4. Legislative Vacancies Reform

25% of our legislature was appointed, not elected. Forward supports reforms to ensure that the voters decide who will represent them.

5. Prioritized Community Issues - bottom-up solutions

We support community groups to identify the issues important to them and bring forward solutions to better address their unique needs.

Dear Committee,

I am writing on behalf of the Maryland Forward Party and our 6,000 Maryland supporters. Forward Party is among the fastest growing political organizations in the United States and in Maryland. Our organization is dedicated to promoting and enhancing our democracy in Maryland. We also believe that all Maryland taxpayers should have an opportunity to be heard. In Maryland there is need to reform the process for which vacancies in the General Assembly be filled.

SB 0002 is proposing a constitutional amendment to require that a special election be held at the same time as the regular statewide primary and general elections that are held in the second year of the term to fill a vacancy in the office of Delegate or Senator in the General Assembly, if the vacancy occurs on or before the date that is 55 days before the deadline for filing certificates of candidacy for the regular statewide election. The Forward, Libertarian, and Green Parties Agree

The people of Manyland deserve greater legitimacy and confidence in our electoral system. We have inherited our way of voting from the 1700s, and other systems exist that would better represent the voter diversity across Manyland. We, the undersigned political parieties from across the political spectrum in Manyland, announce our joint support for electoral reform, including Ranked Choice Verigina of Independent Redistricting Commissions and will jointly advocate for immediate legislation to effect their implementation throughouth the State of Manyland.

Failures in Election Legitimacy

One fundamental reason for this lack of legitimacy is the inability to vote for more than one candidate. We don't know if people would be satisfied with multiple candidates, or are webmentity opposed to one or more.

"In a traditional "first-past-the-post" system, voters may feel pressured to vote for the lesser of two evils' instead of their preferred candidate to avoid 'wasting' their vote. Ranked-choice voting eliminates this issue by allowing voters to rank their preferred candidates in order, without worrying about spoilers or wasted votes."

Voters want more options. When voters can't assert all their preferences, our elected officials are consistently selected by a minority of voters. That is not good enough because everyone will

Many voters also see the outcomes of elections as a foregone conclusion which leads to apathy in voter participation. Most elections in Manyland are decided during the primaries, making the general election just a formality, in addition, Manyland is noticrious for having externely genymandered legislative districts that have been crafted to allow current elected officials to choose their voters, rather than the voters choosing their elected officials.

How Does Election Reform Create Legitimacy?

Independent Redistricting Commissions and Ranked Choice Voting (RCV) retain the concept of 'one-person, one-vote' while allowing voters to register their approval of multiple candidates at the same time. Given that Maryland has voting machines capable of Ranked Choice Voting, the Maryland legislature has fewer obstacles than other states to enable this reform at all levels of government. "[RCV] ensures that the eventual winner has majority support and allows voters to express their preferences knowing that supporting their favorite candidate will not inadvertently help their least favored candidate...and saves money by eliminating unnecessary run-off elections."

On Wednesday, February 21, 2024, our chair took some time off work to go testify at the working session of the Frederick County Board of Alderman about the Charter Review Committee Recommendations. There are 19 separate recommendations to the Board of Alderman by the Charter Review Committee, however, two were singled out for the testimony.

Here is the text of the testimony:

Good afternoon - My name is Matthew Beyers and I am a citizen of Frederick County and represent the Maryland Forward Party. While I live just outside the city limits, I am paying close attention to the City Charter Review as it relates to democracy and the way we do politics in Maryland.

In general, I support the recommendations of the Commission, however, I'd like to highlight my support for 2 of these recommendations.

First: Recommendation 9 - Ranked Choice Voting.

As a member of the Maryland Forward party, this is one of our core principles and I highly support this change to promote fairness, civility, and majority in elections. This will ensure that every elected office has a majority elected candidate. It will also encourage candidates to appeal to 2nd and 3rd choice voters beyond their base and thus increases civility in politics. And lastly, it increases fairness because all voters get to vote their conscience while still having their vote count if their preferred candidate is not the first choice. RCV currently works in Takoma Park MD and is being supported by HB 0423 to be available in Montgomery County. My team is currently supporting and promoting RCV in several other municipalities specifically New Carrolton, Laurel, Bowie, Rockville, and Annapolis. If Frederick adopts RCV, it will be a leader in a growing effort to reform elections across the state. We encourage your support for this recommendation.

Second: Recommendation 10 - Primaries.

Non-partisan primaries, where all candidates for an office run in a single primary regardless of party affiliation, is a core principle of the Maryland Forward Party. We would prefer to see the idea of a top-4/top-5 candidate selection from this single primary. The recommendation for semi-open primaries, while not my ideal solution, is a step in the right direction because it involves non-affiliated voters in the primary process and does not require them to switch party affiliation to vote. This is critical because the majority of our voting process is done in the primary system, resulting in a winnowing down of a sea of candidates to a few to run in the general election. Unfortunately, the current primary system is only attended by about 13% of registered voters selecting those candidates and those voters tend to be the most polarized voters and this results in polarized candidates. Involving independent voters in the primary process should result in more moderate candidates with more general appeal to all voters and should lower the tribalism of our current political system. HB 0257 is currently supporting this concept as well and we encourage your support for this recommendation.



Prioritized Epic Problems:

- Dangerous Candidates: If National Forward Party aligned itself with or supported a candidate for President in the election cycle that grossly violated the Candidate Pledge, or was dishonest or undemocratic.
- Separation of Church and State: Any candidate who voices policies for one religion over another and is not disavowed by National Forward Party
- Disenfranchisement: If National Forward Party engages in practices that disenfranchise voters or encourage voter apathy.
- Policy Stances: If National Forward Party were to start dictating policy stances to candidates and elected officials counter to the party values.
- Disintegration of Principles: If National Forward Party were to modify their Legislative principles without ratification through national vote by the membership.
 - Example: A big money donor offered to give the party 25 million dollars, but only if Forward removed the Open non-partisan primaries principle.
