EMV TICKET REMINDER

Charlestown's performing arts groups are gearing up for the 2025-2026 season and we look forward to presenting some wonderful and exciting performances! In that spirit, I would like to offer a gentle reminder to those who plan to sit in their EMV during a performance in the Auditorium or Conference Center to please be sure to request an EMV ticket.

The Auditorium has a firm limit of 8 EMV parking spaces, so we want to make sure attendees have a space reserved to park their EMV. The Conference Center has more flexibility with EMV parking, but depending on the setup, there is still a limit to the number of EMVs we can safely accommodate. All performing arts groups will have specially marked EMV tickets available at their ticket sales or distributions, so be sure to request an EMV ticket if you plan to enjoy a show in your EMV.

If you plan to drive your EMV to a performance and then transfer a permanent seat, you do <u>not</u> need to purchase an EMV ticket.

Accented by a warm, personal stage presence, these women deliver their music with rare intensity and contagious enthusiasm. This is an act not to be missed!

The wit, humor, and sophistication, Cole Porter, one of America's greatest songwriters is showcased by vocalist Sue Matthews and pianist Joe Holt. Porter



composed for Broadway shows and Hollywood films and many of his songs are jazz standards. Sue and Joe will perform a variety of Porter's hits such as "Night and Day," "I Get A Kick Out of You," and "Anything Goes".

As a "standards" vocalist with a silky voice, exquisite phrasing, and a passion for finding every bit of meaning in a song, Sue is noted for her "Great American Songbook" series of shows which feature 10 music legends. With an infectious vitality, she's entertained audiences across America and around the world in top jazz clubs, concert halls, and music festivals from the U.S. and Canada to South America and Europe.

Joe Holt is a pianist known for his whimsical improvisations and joy-filled performances, along with being a sensitive accompanist and collaborator. His formal studies span jazz and classical, and the influence of both worlds can be heard in his uniquely melodic approach to the piano. Joe was at Charlestown last February as the pianist in the trio that performed the warmly received "Music of Duke Ellington" concert in the Chapel.

The duo performs a wide repertoire of jazz standards, gypsy jazz, Brazilian, Latin, New Orleans and even a bit of country. During this past year this unique duo

has played concerts in homes, a community center, the Howard County Center for the Arts and Syriana restaurant. Sounds of Surprise is only one of a few clarinet/mandolin combos in the US and the only one in the mid-Atlantic region. They are also multi-generational to an extreme with Leo in his early 20s and Bob at 74.
