The wit, humor, and sophistication, Cole Porter, one of America's greatest songwriters is showcased by vocalist Sue Matthews and pianist Joe Holt. Porter

composed Broadway shows and Hollywood films and many of his songs are jazz standards. Sue and Joe will perform a variety of Porter's hits such as "Night and Day," "I Get A Kick Out of You," and "Anything Goes".

As a "standards" vocalist with a silky voice, exquisite phrasing, and a passion for finding every bit of meaning in a song, Sue is known for her "Great American Songbook" series of shows which feature 10 music legends. With an infectious vitality, she has entertained audiences across America and around the world in top jazz clubs, concert halls, and music festivals from the U.S. and Canada to South America and Europe.

Joe Holt is a pianist known for his whimsical improvisations and joy-filled performances, along with being a sensitive accompanist and collaborator. His formal studies span jazz and classical, and the influence of both worlds can be heard in his uniquely melodic approach to the piano. Joe was at Charlestown last February as the pianist in the trio that performed the warmly received "Music of Duke Ellington" concert in the Chapel.

The Harmonizers are a joyful group of nearly 50 Charlestown seniors who love to sing. Our members, in various stages of aging, bring with them a range of musical experiences, ranging from church choirs to masterwork choruses. Together, we create music that uplifts our community and each other.

At the heart of our ensemble is our director, Linda Burgard, whose deep knowledge and great directing talent make every rehearsal a rich musical experience. Not only does our director lead rehearsals- 4 hours each week- but also carefully selects programs and music that best suit our voices and promises entertaining concerts. Supporting us is our gifted accompanist, Celeste Blase, who dedicates two hours each week to rehearsals and provides artistry at our concerts.

Behind the scenes, a capable steering committee manages everything from our music library and publicity to ticketing, finances and stage logistics. Their dedication ensures that each performance runs smoothly. And when possible, additional musicians are hired to further enrich the music we present.

Why Do the Harmonizers Need Funding?
